WHY SHOULD YOUR CHILDREN ARRIVE TO SCHOOL ON TIME?

There are many benefits your child will gain from arriving on time to school and class. Did you know? The likelihood of success in learning is strongly linked to strong participation in school programs which is linked to arriving on time. It is very important for children to develop habits of arriving on time at an early age, beginning from the time they start school.

Some Gains for Your Child Arriving on Time for School and Class:

- Makes sure that your child doesn't miss out on the important learning activities that happen early in the day when they are most alert.
- Early morning learning activities are often pre-reading, pre-math and/ or pre-writing. Your child can lose so many opportunities to learn these critical life skills.
 - Helps your child to learn about routines and commitments.
- Gives your child time to greet their friends before class and this can reduce the possibility of disruptions in the classroom.
 - Class disruption may also delay the lunch process and napping schedules.
 - Arriving on time every day makes children feel good about themselves

***SPECIAL NOTE:** School starts at **8:30a.m. daily**. The **cut-off time is at 9:30a.m.** If your child(ren) must arrive after 9:30a.m. please call the Front Office to make us aware of the situation.

10 HOUR CORE TIME

Just a friendly reminder that *World View Early Learning and Christian Center* has a 10-hour core time policy **each day**. What that means is your child can only be at the Center for **10 hours in a given day**. If you need more than 10 hours of care per day on a consistent basis, you must complete an **“Extended Care”** form located in the office. By completing this form, you will be charged **\$5.00 per day (preschool) and \$10.00 per day (infant/toddler) or portion thereof**. If you do not complete an **“Extended Care Form”**, you will be charged **\$10.00 per hour (Preschool) and \$15.00 per hour (Infant/Toddler) or portion thereof** for any time over 10 hours each day.
